(2)	It is very clear that Saul God's instructions. (15:4-9)
(3)	It is very clear that both God and Samuel sincerely wanted Saul to (15:10-11)
(4)	It is very clear that Saul had a serious issue. (15:12-24)
(5)	It is very clear that Saul was more concerned with being of Israel than knowing God. (15:25-35)
How do we foolishly define our self-worth?	
(1)	We value the assessment of those who love us over those who do.
(2)	We insist on seeing ourselves as no matter how much others value us.
(3)	We consider the assessment of people.
(4)	We base our self-worth on talents, personality, appearance, financial well-being, etc.
(5)	We base our self-worth on our societal (cumulative value to society).
How do we wisely establish our self-worth? – When we, above every assessment, cherish, meditate on, and refuse to alter anything about the our Creator, Eternal Father, and Redeemer has clearly declared about us, then and only then will we be able to see and wisely consider the value others place on us.
