(2)	Amos pleaded for for Israel. (7:1-9)

As we respond to the sin of others with the TRUTH, we need to remember the following:	
(1)	We cannot effectively point a lost world Jesus if we hate it. (Matthew 5:43-48, Romans 2:4, 2 Peter 3:9)
(2)	We cannot effectively point rebellious brothers and sisters to Christ if we hate them for turning away. (Galatians 6:1-2, Ephesians 4:31, 2 Thessalonians 3:6 15, 1 John 3:15)
Challenge: What does the attitude of your prayers, or lack of prayers, for those who are openly rebelling against God say about the condition of your heart? What do your prayers say about your heart for those who have sinned against?
